At AGFS, we aim to provide an outstanding extra-curricular programme to complement our rigorous academic curriculum.

This booklet outlines the sports, performing arts and academics activities available to scholars for the Autumn/Spring term. After an incredibly successful 2022-2023, we are looking to raise the bar again with our 2023-2024 programme to give our scholars an even bigger range of culturally enriching opportunities outside of the traditional curriculum.
